The IAMAW would like to provide communication on the CO-OP program currently initiated in YYC, YUL and YYZ. MOA 14, Work placement Programs (CO-OP) came about in the last round of collective bargaining. In addition to MOA 14, Transportation District 140 has signed a separate Memorandum of Agreement (dated July 21, 2017) outlining the conditions and expectations of this program. The intent of this agreement is to ensure a positive and healthy work environment, attracting a steady and stable stream of up and coming industry professionals. You can reference the MOA in your local Shop Committee.

A well represented National CO-OP Committee has been formed and the members are listed below. We have been actively participating with Air Canada in the development of this program. As a result, we are witnessing an influx of College students throughout our work places. Currently we have approximately 40 CO-OP students in YYZ, 20 in YUL and 4 in YYC.

Introducing a structured co-operative learning environment with well-designed framework and concise objectives will assist in raising the profile and professionalism of our work groups. Ultimately, the entire aircraft maintenance industry will stand to benefit nationwide.
